Breaks are a Contractual Right – Not a Legal Right

There is no state or federal law requiring employers to give workers age 18 and over a break. The reason all UFCW 951 members receive breaks is because of their union contract. When members skip their breaks, they are putting this contractual right in jeopardy.

“Since breaks are a collective bargaining topic, not a legal requirement, they are up for negotiation every time a new contract is bargained,” John Cakmakci, UFCW 951 president, said. “Employers keep track of skipped breaks to support their contract proposal to cut or eliminate breaks. Their position is that workers must not really need breaks since they aren’t taking them.”

Protecting their contractual rights is one reason UFCW 951 urges members to take their breaks. When members skip breaks, they are also giving the company money, taking hours away from their coworkers and making it appear their workplace is fully staffed.

“When managers refuse to give members their breaks, they are violating the contract, and a grievance should be filed,” Cakmakci said. “UFCW 951 recently settled a grievance for 40 members at one store who were collectively denied 418 breaks. They shared a \$950 settlement.”

To file a grievance for a denied break, contact your union steward.

Collective Bargaining Update

Harding’s #356 – In April, members at Harding’s #356 overwhelmingly ratified a new contract. The union was able to negotiate an increase in pension contributions and pay raises for all employees, and limit healthcare cost increases with a commitment from the company to review the cost every year. A special thanks goes to Chris Roush and Candice Roow for their assistance with the negotiation and ratification of the new contract.

Valley City Linen – UFCW 951 and the company have reached tentative agreement on much of the contract language. Negotiations continue on a few key areas including wages.

JBS – UFCW 951 and JBS have agreed to begin contract negotiations early because an opportunity exists for the union to secure additional wage increases for all current JBS members, along with greatly improved health benefits.
